



GOLDEN STATE WATER COMPLIES WITH SAFE DRINKING WATER ACT

Golden State Water is committed to providing customers with high quality reliable drinking water and complying with all state and federal drinking water standards.

The Safe Drinking Water Act (SDWA) requires the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to issue a list of unregulated contaminants for which community water systems with more than 10,000 people must monitor every five years.

To adhere to SDWA regulations, Golden State Water began collecting data for the EPA in January, 2013 in its applicable water systems and will continue collecting data through December, 2015. Throughout this process, Golden State Water will continue to closely monitor drinking water. The monitoring process does not impact a customer's drinking water.

To ensure the quality of your drinking water, Golden State Water regularly tests for more than 230 regulated and unregulated elements in our water systems. Golden State Water's industry professionals periodically take samples to monitor water quality throughout the distribution system.
