SUBJECT: Preliminary Statements Update

PURPOSE

GSWC is modifying its Preliminary Statements, to add Parts HHHH, IIII, and JJJJ, to reflect the establishment and implementation of the Conservation Expenses One-Way Balancing Account-2019 ("CEOWBA-2019"), the General Ratemaking Area Balancing Account ("GRABA"), and the San Luis Obispo Valley Groundwater Basin Memorandum Account ("SLOVGBMA"), respectively. This advice letter is being filed in accordance with Ordering Paragraph Nos. 1, 12, 60, and 61 in Decision No. ("D.") 19-05-044, dated May 30, 2019.

The purpose of the CEOWBA-2019 is to track the difference between actual conservation program expenses and authorized conservation program expenses and refund to GSWC customers amounts included in rates which were not spent during the 3-year

authorization cycle (2019-2021). GSWC shall maintain a separate CEOWBA-2019 for each of its ratemaking districts.

The purpose of the GRABA is to aggregate small residual dollar amounts from expired authorized amortizations and other authorized dollar amounts (e.g. intervener compensation awards) for subsequent amortization at the ratemaking area level.

The purpose of the SLOVGBMA is to record the expenses GSWC incurs related to the implementation of the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act ("SGMA") in the San Luis Obispo Groundwater Basin. This will include expenses incurred as a member of the City of San Luis Obispo and the County of San Luis Obispo's Groundwater Sustainability Commission ("GSC"). The GSC's purpose is to develop a single Groundwater Sustainability Plan as required under SGMA for the groundwater basin and to engage in such other activities as may be necessary or appropriate to ensure successful SGMA implementation.

BACKGROUND

On May 30, 2019, the California Public Utilities Commission ("Commission") issued D. 19-05-044, which in Ordering Paragraph No. 1, approved the settlement agreement between GSWC and the Public Advocates Office (formerly known as Office of Ratepayer Advocates or ORA). Ordering Paragraph No. ("OP") 1 in D.19-05-044, states,

1. The joint motion filed on August 15, 2018, for the adoption of the Settlement Agreement, is granted. The Settlement Agreement attached to this decision as Appendix A is adopted, with the exception of the request to file rate base offset letters for the projects listed in table 3.14 of the Settlement Agreement as covered in sections 3.4, 3.6 and 3.7 of the Settlement Agreement.

OP 12 authorizes GSWC to file a Tier 1 advice letter to establish a General Ratemaking Area Balancing Account ("GRABA").

12. Golden State Water Company is authorized to establish a General Ratemaking Area Balancing Account (GRABA) for each ratemaking area, and to file a Tier 1 advice letter to add a preliminary statement that is substantially similar to the relevant draft preliminary statement in Appendix J of the Settlement Agreement attached to this decision. Small residual balances that meet certain conditions may be transferred to the relevant ratemaking GRABA so that they can be aggregated and amortized together.

OP 60 authorizes GSWC to establish a Conservation Expenses One-Way Balancing Account-2019 ("CEOWBA-2019").

60. Golden State Water Company is authorized to open a Conservation Expenses One-Way Balancing Account-2019 to record the differences Between actual conservation expenses and total authorized conservation expenses on a triennial basis in each ratemaking area.

OP 61 authorizes GSWC to file a Tier 1 advice letter to establish a San Luis Obispo Valley Groundwater Basin Memorandum Account ("SLOVGBMA").

61. Golden State Water Company (Golden State) is authorized to establish the San Luis Obispo Valley Groundwater Basin Memorandum Account with an effective date of January 1, 2018 and to include a Preliminary Statement for the account in the Tier 1 advice letter implementing this decision, provided that (i) if Golden State elects to request recovery of costs tracked in the account, Golden State shall provide detailed justification clearly demonstrating that costs tracked are necessary for the protection of ratepayers' interest and are not already funded in base rates, and (ii) for expense forecasting purposes in the next General Rate Case, Golden State shall exclude all recorded costs associated with Golden State's activities related to the development of any associated joint powers authority.

COMPLIANCE

Submission of the tariffs included in this advice letter is made in full compliance with Ordering Paragraph Nos. 1, 12, 60, and 61 in D.19-05-044.

TIER DESIGNATION

Pursuant to D. 19-05-044, this advice letter is submitted with a Tier 1 designation.

EFFECTIVE DATE

GSWC is requesting this advice letter become effective on June 8, 2019.

RESPONSE OR PROTEST

Anyone may submit a response or protest for this Advice Letter (AL). When submitting a response or protest, please include the utility name and advice letter number in the subject line.

A **response** supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the AL. A **protest** objects to the AL in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

1. The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the AL;

- 2. The relief requested in the AL would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- 3. The analysis, calculations, or data in the AL contain material error or omissions;
- 4. The relief requested in the AL is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
- 5. The relief requested in the AL requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the AL process; or
- 6. The relief requested in the AL is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory, provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require re-litigating a prior order of the Commission.

A protest may not rely on policy objections to an AL where the relief requested in the AL follows rules or directions established by statute or Commission order applicable to the utility. A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest.

Division of Water and Audits (DWA) must receive a response or protest via email (<u>or</u> postal mail) within 20 days of the date the AL is filed. When submitting a response or protest, please include the utility name and advice letter number in the subject line.

The informing document should include an estimate of the date the proposed protest might be voted on.

REPLIES

The utility shall reply to each protest and may reply to any response. Any reply must be received by DWA within five business days after the end of the protest period, and shall be served on the same day on each person who filed the protest or response to the AL.

The actions requested in this advice letter are not now the subject of any formal filings with the California Public Utilities Commission, including a formal complaint, nor action in any court of law.

Cities and counties that need Board of Supervisors or Board of Commissioners approval to protest should inform the Water Division, within the 20-day protest period, so that a late filed protest can be entertained. The informing document should include an estimate of the date the proposed protest might be voted on.

Preliminary Statements Conservation Expenses One-Way Balancing Account -2019

HHHH. CONSERVATION EXPENSES ONE-WAY BALANCING ACCOUNT- 2019

(N)

1. Purpose

The purpose of the Conservation Expenses One-Way Balancing Account -2019 (CEOWBA2019) is to track the difference between actual conservation program expenses and authorized conservation program expenses and refund to GSWC customers amounts included in rates which were not spent during the 3-year authorization cycle (2019-2021). Per D. 19-05-044, GSWC shall maintain a separate CEOWBA2019 for each of its ratemaking districts.

2. Applicability

The CEOWBA2019 covers years 2019 through 2021 for all GSWC ratemaking districts.

GSWC shall maintain the CEOWBA2019 as follows:

Accounting:

- a. The net difference between the annual actual conservation program expenses and the annual authorized conservation program expenses, as adopted in D.19-05-044, shall be recorded in the CEOWBA2019. If the authorized conservation program expenses included in rates exceeds the actual annual conservation program expenses incurred, a positive entry shall be entered. If the actual conservation program expenses incurred exceeds the authorized conservation program expenses included in rates, a negative entry shall be entered.
- b. Interest shall accrue on the CEOWBA2019 beginning January 1, 2019 by applying the 3-month Commercial Paper Rate Non-Financial, as reported in the Federal Reserve Statistical Release, only if the authorized conservation program expenses included in rates exceeds the actual annual conservation program expenses at the end of 2021.

Refund:

If at the end of 2021 the cumulative balance in the CEOWBA2019 is positive (meaning the authorized program expenses included in rates exceed the actual conservation program expenses incurred), GSWC shall refund the net difference to customers in that particular customer service area. If at the end of 2021 the amount in the cumulative balance is negative (meaning the actual conservation program expenses incurred exceed the authorized program expenses included in rates), then that balance shall not be collected from customers.

3. Effective Date

The CEOWBA2019 shall have the effective date of January 1, 2019.

4. Termination

The CEOWBA2019 shall terminate on December 31, 2021, or when the surcredit (if applicable) expires, whichever is later.

5. Disposition

GSWC will file a Tier 2 advice letter with the Water Division to dispose of any refunds recorded in the CEOWBA2019.

IIII. GENERAL RATEMAKING AREA BALANCING ACCOUNT ("GRABA")

(N)

PURPOSE

The purpose of the General Ratemaking Area Balancing Account ("GRABA") is to aggregate small residual dollar amounts from expired authorized amortizations and other authorized dollar amounts (e.g. intervener compensation awards) for subsequent amortization at the ratemaking area level.

Note: A small residual balance would encompass any balance less than 2% of gross adopted revenues by ratemaking area.

APPLICABILITY

The GRABA does not have a rate component. Each ratemaking area will have a GRABA.

ACCOUNTING PROCEDURE

Entries to the GRABA shall be made as a result of the termination of an authorized amortization that has a small residual balance and should be accompanied by a Tier 1 advice letter filing requesting approval of the rollover of the small residual balance to the GRABA and closure of the originating Balancing/Memorandum Account Preliminary Statement.

GSWC shall maintain the GRABA by making entries as follows:

- a. A debit or credit entry shall be made to the GRABA to record the authorized intervenor compensation award or the small residual balance due to the termination of a previously authorized balancing/memorandum account amortization.
- b. Interest shall accrue to the GRABA on a monthly basis by applying a rate equal to one-twelfth of the 3-month Commercial Paper Rate*, as reported in the Federal Reserve Statistical Release, to the average of the beginning-of-month and the end-of-month balances.

*Note: If a particular BAMA has been authorized an alternative interest rate other than the 3-month Commercial Paper Rate, GSWC will continue to use the alternative interest rate while the account is being tracked in the GRABA.

EFFECTIVE DATE

The GRABA shall have the effective date of January 1, 2019.

DISPOSITION

GSWC will amortize balances recorded in the GRABA in a Tier 2 advice letter filing, if the accumulated balance exceeds 2% of gross adopted revenues for a particular ratemaking area, in accordance with General Order 96-B and standard practices or by request in its next general rate case.

The GSC's purpose is to develop a single Groundwater Sustainability Plan as required under SGMA for the groundwater basin and to engage in such other activities as may be necessary or appropriate to ensure successful SGMA implementation.

Expected SGMA related expenses include, but not limited to the following types of activities:

- Groundwater Sustainability Commission (GSC) general administration;
- Consultant services for the preparation of the GSP;
- Legal Support;
- Stakeholder outreach;
- Shared implementation expenses

2. APPLICABILITY

The SLOVGBMA does not have a rate component.

- a. A debit entry shall be made to the SLOVGBMA at the end of each month to Record GSWC's allowable expenses as a Participating Party in the MOA and costs associated with being a member of the Groundwater Sustainability Commission.
- b. Interest shall accrue to the SLOVGBMA on a monthly basis by applying a rate equal to one-twelfth of the 3-month Commercial Paper Rate, as reported in the Federal Reserve Statistical Release, to the average of the beginning-of-month and the end-of-month balances.

3. EFFECTIVE DATE

The SLOVGBMA shall have an effective date of January 1, 2018.

4. **DISPOSITION**

Disposition of amounts recorded in the SLOVGBMA shall be determined in GSWC's next General Rate Case application or by advice letter, if the account's cumulative balance exceeds 2% of GSWC's adopted gross revenues in any given year.
