Subject: 2023 Escalation Year - Region 2

PURPOSE

This advice letter submittal seeks to implement Escalation Year 2023 water rates, as authorized by the California Public Utilities Commission ("Commission"), for the Region 2 CSAs. GSWC's request is being made pursuant to Decision No. 23-06-024, dated June 29, 2023 for GSWC's General Rate Case Application (Application No. 20-07-012). Specifically, Ordering Paragraph No. 1 of Decision No. 23-06-024 states,

1. *The Joint Motion of Golden State Water Company and the Public Advocates Office for the Adoption of a Settlement Agreement, filed November 23, 2021, is granted; and the Settlement Agreement attached to this decision as Appendix A is approved and adopted.*

Ordering Paragraph No. 6 states,

6. For escalation years 2023 and 2024, Golden State Water Company (GSW) must file Tier 1 advice letters in conformance with General Order 96-B proposing new revenue requirements and corresponding revised tariff schedules for each ratemaking area in this proceeding. The advice letters must follow the escalation procedures set forth in the Revised Rate Case Plan for Class A Water Utilities adopted in Decision 07-05-062 and must include supporting workpapers. GSW must file for rate reduction if the escalation procedures result in a rate reduction due to negative rate base growth, inflation factors, or customer growth. The revised tariffs shall be effective as of January 1, 2023, and January 1, 2024, respectively and apply to services rendered on and after their effective dates. The proposed revised revenue requirements and rates must be reviewed by the Commission's Water Division. The Water Division must inform the Commission if it finds that the revised rates do not conform to the Revised Rate Case Plan, this decision, or other Commission decisions, and if so, reject

COMPLIANCE

GSWC is filing this advice letter to implement rates for Escalation Year 2023. GSWC is authorized to increase rates in its Region 2 CSAs by \$7,642,994 or 4.71%. Accordingly, GSWC has computed the 2023 Escalation Year using the escalation methodology set forth in the Revised Rate Case Plan, the escalation factors as of May 2023 as published by the Public Advocates Office Energy Cost of Service Branch, and the May 2023 CPI-U.

RATE OF RETURN

The following summary lists the Recorded, Authorized, Adjusted Authorized, and Pro-forma rates of return in GSWC's Region 2 CSAs for twelve months ending September 2022. The pro forma rate of return is calculated in accordance with the escalation procedures set forth in the Revised Rate Case Plan for Class A Water Utilities adopted in Decision 07-05-062.

As shown above, the Pro-forma rate of return is higher than the Authorized rate of return. As such, GSWC adjusted its proposed 2023 water rate increase, accordingly.

Detailed workpapers supporting the proposed rate calculations are being supplied to the Commission Staff.

TEMPORARY SURCHARGES AND SURCREDITS

In compliance with D.23-06-024, GSWC will be implementing the temporary surcharges and surcredits, as shown in Appendix I in the Settlement Agreement, on the effective of the 2023 Escalation rates.

TIER DESIGNATION

This advice letter is submitted with a Tier 1 designation.

EFFECTIVE DATE

As directed, the effective date of these revised tariffs shall be July 31, 2023.

CUSTOMER NOTICE

This is a Tier 1 advice letter that does not require customer notification, as provided in Water Industry Rule 7.3.1 of General Order 96-B. GSWC will include a bill message on each customer's bill after the increase goes into effect to inform its Region 2 customers of this rate increase.

RESPONSE OR PROTEST

Anyone may submit a response or protest for this Advice Letter (AL). When submitting a response or protest, **please include the utility name and advice letter number in the subject line.**

A **response** supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter. A **protest** objects to the AL in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

1. The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the AL;
2. The relief requested in the AL would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
3. The analysis, calculations, or data in the AL contain material error or omissions;
4. The relief requested in the AL is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
5. The relief requested in the AL requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the AL process; or
6. The relief requested in the AL is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory, provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require re-litigating a prior order of the Commission.

A protest may not rely on policy objections to an AL where the relief requested in the AL follows rules or directions established by statute or Commission order applicable to the utility. A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest.

WD must receive a response or protest via email (or postal mail) within 20 days of the date the AL is filed. When submitting a response or protest, **please include the utility name and advice letter number in the subject line.**

Cities and counties that need Board of Supervisors or Board of Commissioners approval to protest should inform WD, within the 20-day protest period, so that a late filed protest can be entertained. The informing document should include an estimate of the date the proposed protest might be voted on.

REPLIES

The utility shall reply to each protest and may reply to any response. Any reply must be received by WD within five business days after the end of the protest period, and shall be served on the same day on each person who filed the protest or response to the AL.

The actions requested in this advice letter are not now the subject of any formal filings with the California Public Utilities Commission, including a formal complaint, nor action in any court of law.

No individuals or utilities have requested notification of filing of tariffs. Distribution of this advice letter is being made to the attached service list in accordance with General Order No. 96-B.

No structure shall be built over the private fire service facilities and the customer shall maintain and safeguard the area occupied by the private fire service facilities from traffic and other hazardous conditions. The customer will be responsible for any damage to the private fire service facilities whether resulting from the use or operation of appliances and facilities on customer's premises or otherwise. 8. Subject to the approval of the utility, any change in the location or construction of the private fire service facilities as may be requested by public authority or the customer will be made by the utility following payment to the utility of the entire cost of such change. (L)

Any unauthorized cross connection may be grounds for immediately discontinuing private fire service without liability to the utility.
11. The utility will supply only such water as such pressure as may be available from time to time as a result of its operation of the system. The customer shall indemnify the utility and save it harmless against any and all claims arising out of service under this schedule and shall further agree to make no claims against the utility for any loss or damage resulting from service under this schedule. Section 774 of the Public Utilities Code limits the liability of the utility resulting from a claim regarding adequacy of pressure of supply for fire protection service.
12. The customer shall be responsible for the periodic testing of any black flow prevention devices as required by public authority or the utility. Any repair or replacement of such devices or of any other facilities installed to provide private fire service shall be done at the customer's expense. Any refusal to comply with the above requirements may be grounds for the utility's discontinuing private fire service without liability to the utility.
