GSWC is seeking authorization from the California Public Utilities Commission (Commission) to increase the water rates in its Region 2 CSA by \$4,353,585 or 2.52% to offset purveyor rate changes for purchased water and pump tax costs.

Background

GSWC purchases water from various purveyors within the Region 2 CSA. On January 1, 2023 Suburban Water Systems increased their water rates. Central Basin MWD, West Basin MWD, City of South Gate, City of Cerritos, and City of Lakewood will increased their water rates, effective January 1, 2024. This resulted in an increase in GSWC's annual purchased water expense of \$3,482,835.

GSWC pays a replenishment assessment to the Water Replenishment District of Southern California (WRD) for all water pumped. Effective July 1, 2023, WRD will increase their rates for pump taxes. This will result in an increase in GSWC's annual pump tax expense of \$797,837 above the amount currently reflected in GSWC's rates.

Revenues to cover the supply expense rate changes would also increase the uncollectible and franchise fees expenses by \$15,369 and \$57,545, respectively, above the amounts currently reflected in GSWC's rates.

An increase \$4,353,585 or 2.52% to Adopted Gross Revenue is needed to offset the overall supply expense increase in Region 2.

Copies of detailed workpapers supporting the proposed rate increase and rate calculations have been provided to the Commission Staff in accordance with Standard Practice U-27-W.

Effective Date

This advice letter is submitted with a Tier 1 designation. GSWC is requesting this filing become effective January 1, 2024.

Notice

No individuals or utilities have requested notification of filing of tariffs. Distribution of this advice letter is being made to the attached service list in accordance with Section 4.3 of General Order No. 96-B.

GSWC will notify its customers of this rate increase by placing a message on the customer's water bills that are generated after the increase goes into effect.

Response or Protest

Anyone may submit a response or protest for this Advice Letter (AL). When submitting a response or protest, please include the utility name and advice letter number in the subject line.

A **response** supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the AL. A **protest** objects to the AL in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

- 1. The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the AL;
- 2. The relief requested in the AL would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- 3. The analysis, calculations, or data in the AL contain material error or omissions;
- 4. The relief requested in the AL is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
- 5. The relief requested in the AL requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the AL process; or
- 6. The relief requested in the AL is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory, provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require re-litigating a prior order of the Commission.

A protest may not rely on policy objections to an AL where the relief requested in the AL follows rules or directions established by statute or Commission order applicable to the utility. A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest.

WD must receive a response or protest via email (<u>or</u> postal mail) within 20 days of the date the AL is filed. When submitting a response or protest, **please include the utility name** and advice letter number in the subject line. The addresses for submitting a response or protest is:

The informing document should include an estimate of the date the proposed protest might be voted on.

Replies

The utility shall reply to each protest and may reply to any response. Any reply must be received by WD within five business days after the end of the protest period, and shall be served on the same day on each person who filed the protest or response to the AL. The actions requested in this advice letter are not now the subject of any formal filings with the California Public Utilities Commission, including a formal complaint, nor action in any court of law.

Beginning January 1, 2024, as required by Section 792.5 of the Public Utilities Code, an increase in Purchased Water of \$0.39039/Ccf and an increase in Pump Tax of \$0.06590/Ccf, relative to the Purchased Water cost adopted by Decision No. 23-06-024, and an associated revenue increase of 2.52%, are being tracked in a reserve account.
