# Subject

This advice letter requests to amortize the combined balance in the Water Revenue Adjustment Mechanism ("WRAM") balancing account and the Modified Cost Balancing Account ("MCBA") for GSWC's Arden Cordova, Bay Point, Los Osos, Santa Maria, and Simi Valley Customer Service Areas in Region 1; Region 2; and Region 3 Customer Service Areas. This filing includes the 2024 WRAM&MCBA balances along with all residual balances<sup>1</sup> from previous WRAM&MCBA filings<sup>2</sup> and monies collected from Schedule 14.1 drought water use violation fines and drought emergency surcharges<sup>3</sup>. The table below shows the combined balance by ratemaking area:

GSWC is requesting to amortize an under collection in its Arden Cordova, Los Osos, Santa Maria, Simi Valley, Region 2, and Region 3 Customer Service Areas. Additionally, GSWC is requesting to refund an over collection in its Bay Point Customer Service Area. A credit from Schedule 14.1 premium allocation charges is included within the Los Osos and Santa Maria balances.

This request is pursuant to Decision ("D.") No. 12-04-048 authorizing GSWC to amortize its WRAM&MCBA account balances annually. D.12-04-048 Ordering Paragraph 5:

5. Applicants must submit their annual requests for amortization of net Water Revenue Adjustment Mechanism/Modified Cost Balancing Account balances by a Tier 1 Advice Letter on or before March 31<sup>st</sup>.

# **Background**

Pursuant to Decision No. 12-04-048, GSWC is required to submit its annual requests for amortization of net WRAM/MCBA balances on or before March 31st of each year.

# Region 1

For Region 1, the Commission issued D.09-05-005 on May 8, 2009, authorizing the settlement agreements between GSWC and DRA on WRAM and Conservation Rate Design issues pursuant to Ordering Paragraph 1 from D.09-05-005:

1. The Settlement Agreement, as modified by updated conservation rates set forth in Table 1 and Table 2 herein, is approved and adopted.

The purpose and method of tracking WRAM and MCBA is outlined in the D.09-05-005 Settlement Agreement Section V. MECHANISMS FOR DECOUPLING SALES AND REVENUE:

- A. The goals of the decoupling mechanisms in the Pilot Program are as follows:
  - a. Sever the relationship between sales and revenue to remove any disincentive for GSWC to implement conservation rates and conservation programs.
  - b. Ensure cost savings resulting from conservation are passed on to ratepayers.
  - c. Reduce overall water consumption by GSWC ratepayers.
- *B.* Decoupling of GSWC will be accomplished through both the following mechanisms:
  - a. A WRAM for each ratemaking area in Region 1 except Clearlake.
  - b. An MCBA for each ratemaking area in Region 1 except Clearlake. MCBAs will replace existing cost balancing accounts for purchased power, purchased water, and pump tax.
- C. Together, these decoupling mechanisms will ensure recovery of the adopted fixed costs recovered through the quantity charge and the actual variable costs for purchased water, purchased power, and pump taxes. The fixed costs not included in these accounts will be recovered through the service charge, which is a monthly charge that customers pay regardless of consumption.
- D. In accordance with established Commission practice, the WRAM and MCBA accounts will accrue interest at the 90-day commercial paper rate.

The net WRAM balance is allocated to all customers on the general metered<sup>4</sup> rate schedule. The Settlement Agreement Section VI. WATER REVENUE ADJUSTMENT MECHANISM (WRAM) states:

- A. For each ratemaking area in Region 1, except Clearlake, the WRAM will track the differences between the total quantity charge revenues authorized by the Commission ("Total Adopted Quantity Revenues") and the total revenues actually recovered through the quantity charge based on actual sales ("Total Actual Quantity Revenues"), excluding;
  - *1. Fire service revenue;*
  - 2. Unmetered Service revenue;
  - 3. Other non-general metered service revenue.

Per the Settlement Agreement Section VII. MODIFIED COST BALANCING ACCOUNT (MCBA), the activation of MCBA will replace current supply cost balancing accounts. The Settlement Agreement Section VII.C states:

*C.* An MCBA will replace each of the current balancing accounts, now referred to as Supply Cost Balancing Accounts.

 GSWC currently has a Supply Cost Balancing Account for purchased water, purchased power, and pump taxes.
 The Supply Cost Balancing Account tracks cost changes attributable to changes in unit price, but not changes in the amount of consumption.

*3. MCBAs track changes in price and quantity.* 

Non-general metered water services are excluded from the allocation of the net WRAM balance; however, we are including WRAM allocation to tariff LO-RCW. Tariff LO-RCW was added to the system on September 6, 2018 pursuant to Advice Letter 1752-W. Although tariff LO-RCW is a non-general metered tariff, there is currently one customer on the LO-RCW tariff that was transferred from general metered tariff LO-1-NR in 2021 and therefore, should contribute to the amortization of the WRAM&MCBA that they partially generated.

# **Regions 2 and 3**

For Regions 2 and 3, the Commission issued D.08-08-030 on August 25, 2008 authorizing the settlement agreements between GSWC and DRA on WRAM and Conservation Rate Design issues for Regions 2 and 3 pursuant to Ordering Paragraph 1 from D.08-08-030:

- 1. The following settlement agreements are approved and adopted:
  - Golden State Water Company (GSWC)/Division of Ratepayer Advocates (DRA) on conservation rate design trial program and amendment to settlement except the interim rate design for Region I.

The purpose and method of tracking WRAM and MCBA is outlined in the D.08-08-030 Settlement Agreement Section V. MECHANISMS FOR DECOUPLING SALES AND REVENUE:

- A. The goals of the decoupling mechanisms in the Pilot Program are as follows:
  - 1. Sever the relationship between sales and revenue to remove any disincentive for GSWC to implement conservation rates and conservation programs.
  - 2. Ensure cost savings resulting from conservation are passed on to ratepayers.
  - 3. Reduce overall water consumption by GSWC ratepayers.
- *B.* Decoupling for GSWC will be accomplished through both of the following mechanisms:

- 1. A Water Revenue Adjustment Mechanism (WRAM) for each ratemaking area.
- 2. A Modified Cost Balancing Account (MCBA) for each ratemaking area. MCBAs will replace existing cost balancing accounts for purchased power, purchased water, and pump tax.
- 3. In accordance with established Commission practice, the WRAM and MCBA accounts will accrue interest at the 90-day commercial paper rate.

The Settlement Agreement Section VI. WATER REVENUE ADJUSTMENT MECHANISM (WRAM) states:

- B. The WRAM will track the differences between Adopted Revenue and Actual Revenue, excluding;
  - *1. Fire service revenue;*
  - 2. Unmetered Service revenue;
  - 3. Other non-general metered service revenue

Per the Settlement Agreement Section VII. MODIFIED COST BALANCING ACCOUNT (MCBA), the activation of MCBA will replace current supply cost balancing accounts. Section VII.C states:

- *C.* An MCBA will replace each of the current balancing accounts, now referred to as Supply Cost Balancing Accounts:
  - 1. GSWC currently has a Supply Cost Balancing Account for purchased water, purchased power, and pump taxes.
  - 2. The Supply Cost Balancing Account tracks cost changes attributable to changes in unit price, but not changes in the amount of consumption.
  - 3. MCBAs track changes in price and quantity.

Therefore, non-general<sup>5</sup> metered water services are excluded from the allocation of the net WRAM balance for Region 2 and Region 3.

## **Amortization Periods**

On April 30, 2012, the Commission issued D.12-04-048, which amongst other things, changed the amortization period of the Water Revenue Adjustment Mechanism. D.12-04-48 Ordering Paragraph 3:

3. We adopt the amortization schedule set forth in Appendix A with a cap on total net Water Revenue Adjustment Mechanism/Modified Cost Balancing Account (WRAM/MCBA) surcharges of 10% of the last authorized revenue requirement. The cap shall be effective the first test year of each applicant's pending or next General Rate Case, as follows:

-Golden State and Park: Advice Letter filing on March 2014 -Cal Water: Advice Letter filings on March 2015 -Apple Valley: Advice Letter filing on March 2016

WRAM/MCBA account balances incurred prior to the first test year referenced above continue to be amortized under the adopted amortization schedule without being subject to surcharge cap.

Decision No. 12-04-048 also permits:

"...applicants to include any under-amortized or over-amortized amounts from ongoing surcharges or surcredits in their annual Tier 1 Advice Letter submissions. Those ongoing surcharges or surcredits may run until the end of their originally intended amortization terms, provided that the ceiling on annual Advice Letter amortization, discussed earlier, is not exceeded."<sup>6</sup>

In regards to under or over collections, D.12-04-048 Conclusion of Law 7 states:

"It is reasonable to require that net WRAM&MCBA over-collections be amortized through a surcredit on a customer's service charges and that all under-collections be amortized through a surcharge on the volumetric rate."<sup>7</sup>

Pursuant to D.12-04-084, the balance in Arden Cordova and Simi Valley in Region 1, and Region 2 should be amortized over a 12-month period through a volumetric rate, as detailed below. The balance in Los Osos and Santa Maria in Region 1, and Region 3 should be amortized over an 18-month period through a volumetric rate, as detailed below. For Bay Point, the balance should be refunded through a surcredit on a customer's service charge. Except as stated above, WRAM does not apply to non-general metered customers.

# <u>Request</u>

The purpose of this filing is to implement a surcharge to recover the combined WRAM&MCBA under collection in Arden Cordova, Los Osos, Santa Maria, Simi Valley, Region 2, and Region 3; and replace the current WRAM&MCBA surcharges in Arden Cordova, Los Osos, Santa Maria, Simi Valley, Region 2 and Region 3 that were approved through Advice Letter 1938-W upon the effective date of the WRAM&MCBA surcharges from this filing. Additionally, GSWC seeks to implement a sur-credit to refund an over collection in Bay Point. The Bay Point surcharge approved in Advice Letter 1938-W was cancelled on March 28, 2025.

The net WRAM&MCBA balance in Arden Cordova is an under collection of \$896,662 or 4.46% of current adopted annual revenue. GSWC is requesting to decrease the current temporary surcharge from \$0.192 to \$0.186 per Ccf for residential and non-residential metered customers on Schedules No. R1-AC-1-R and Schedule No. R1-AC-1-NR. The requested temporary surcharge would be in effect for a 12-month period beginning on the effective date of this advice letter.

The net WRAM&MCBA balance in Bay Point is an over collection of \$264,003 or -3.16% of current adopted annual revenue. GSWC is requesting a 3-month surcredit for residential and non-residential customers on Schedules No. BY-1-R and BY-1-NR. Please refer to tariffs BY-1-R and BY-1-NR for surcredit amounts.

The net WRAM&MCBA balance in Los Osos is an under collection of \$330,732 or 5.73% of current adopted annual revenue. GSWC is requesting to increase the current temporary surcharge from \$0.847 to \$0.858 per Ccf for residential and non-residential metered customers on Schedules No. LO-1-R and LO-1-NR, and the customer on Schedule No. LO-RCW. The requested temporary surcharge would be in effect for an 18-month period beginning on the effective date of this advice letter.

The net WRAM&MCBA balance in Santa Maria is an under collection of \$2,355,659 or 11.30% of current adopted annual revenue. GSWC is requesting to decrease the current temporary surcharge from \$0.582 to \$0.567 per Ccf for residential and non-residential metered customers on Schedule No. SM-1-R and SM-1-NR; and to increase the current temporary surcharge from \$0.132 to \$0.318

per Ccf for non-general metered customers on Schedule No. SM-3ML. The requested temporary surcharge would be in effect for an 18-month period beginning on the effective date of this advice letter.

The net WRAM&MCBA in Simi Valley is an under collection of \$644,489 or 3.42% of current adopted annual revenue. GSWC is requesting to decrease the current temporary surcharge from \$0.356 to \$0.271 per Ccf for residential and non-residential metered customers on Schedules No. SI-1-R and Schedule No. SI-1-NR. The requested temporary surcharge would be in effect for a 12-month period beginning on the effective date of this advice letter.

The net WRAM&MCBA balance in Region 2 is an under collection of \$7,329,066 or 3.70% of current adopted annual revenue. GSWC is requesting to decrease the current temporary surcharge from \$0.543 to \$0.367 per Ccf for residential and non-residential metered customers on Schedules No. ME-1-R and ME-1-NR; and increase the current temporary surcredit of \$0.024 to \$0.133 per Ccf for non-general metered customers on Schedule No. ME-3 for the over collection of the MCBA balancing accounts in Region 2. The requested temporary surcharge/surcredit would be in effect for a 12-month period beginning on the effective date of this advice letter.

The net WRAM&MCBA balance in Region 3 is an under collection of \$13,554,299 or 7.15% of current adopted annual revenue. GSWC is requesting to decrease the current temporary surcharge of \$0.543 to \$0.408 per Ccf for residential and non-residential metered customers on Schedules No. R3-1-R and R3-1-NR; and to replace the current surcredit of \$0.036 with a surcharge of \$0.045 per Ccf for non-general metered customers on Schedules No. R3-CM-7ML, R3-CMH-3M, R3-SD-3, R3-OC-3M, R3-RCW, and Calipatria Prison for the under collection of the MCBA balancing account in Region 3. The requested temporary surcharge/surcredit would be in effect for an 18-month period beginning on the effective date of this advice letter.

Decision No. 25-01-036 requires GSWC to transition from its existing WRAM to the Monterey-WRAM ("M-WRAM"). As a result, this will be the final WRAM/MCBA filing to amortize the remaining balances included in those accounts. At the end of the amortization periods proposed in this advice letter, GSWC requests authority to transfer any residual balance to the General Ratemaking Area Balancing Account ("GRABA") and to close the WRAM/MCBA preliminary statements.

# Tier designation

Pursuant to D.07-01-024, this advice letter is submitted with a Tier 1 designation.

# Effective date

GSWC is requesting that this filing become effective on May 1, 2025.

However, GSWC will be including a bill message to notify customers of the surcredits and surcharges, where applicable. # **Response or Protest**

Anyone may submit a response or protest for this Advice Letter ("AL"). When submitting a response or protest, please include the utility name and advice letter number in the subject line.

A **response** supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter. A **protest** objects to the AL in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

- 1. The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the AL;
- 2. The relief requested in the AL would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- 3. The analysis, calculations, or data in the AL contain material error or omissions;
- 4. The relief requested in the AL is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
- 5. The relief requested in the AL requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the AL process; or
- 6. The relief requested in the AL is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory, provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require re-litigating a prior order of the Commission.

A protest may not rely on policy objections to an AL where the relief requested in the AL follows rules or directions established by statute or Commission order applicable to the utility. A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest.

The informing document should include an estimate of the date the proposed protest might be voted on.

The utility shall reply to each protest and may reply to any response. Any reply must be received by Water Division within five business days after the end of the protest period, and shall be served on the same day on each person who filed the protest or response to the AL.

The actions requested in this advice letter are not now the subject of any formal filings with the California Public Utilities Commission, including a formal complaint, nor action in any court of law.
