Subject: 2025 Interim Rate True-Up Recovery

GSWC is seeking authorization to implement a temporary surcharge in its Arden-Cordova, Bay Point, Clearlake, Los Osos, Santa Maria, Simi Valley, Region 2 and Region 3 CSAs to recover the revenue shortfall caused by the variance between interim rates (which were in place since January 1, 2025) and final rates implemented on February 1, 2025, via GSWC Advice Letter Nos. 1954-W, 1955-W, and 1956-W. The final rates were adopted in

Decision No. (D.) 25-01-036, dated January 30, 2025, for GSWC's General Rate Case Application No. 23-08-010.

GSWC recorded \$4,416,032 in its 2025 Interim Rates Memorandum Account for the interim period.

The request in this advice letter is being made in conjunction with Administrative Law Judge Amin Nojan's Ruling Granting Motion For Interim Rate Relief, dated December 26, 2024, which granted GSWC interim rates, subject to refund. Specifically, the Ruling states:

IT IS RULED that:

- 1. In accordance with Public Utilities Code Section 455.2, Golden State Water Company is authorized to file with the Commission, by Tier 1 Advice Letter, a tariff implementing interim rates as current rates for its service territories and establishing a memorandum account to track the difference between the interim rates and final rates adopted by the Commission in this proceeding.
- 2. The interim rates shall reflect current rates and shall be subject to upward or downward adjustment back to January 1, 2025, consistent with final rates adopted by the Commission in this proceeding.

Ordering Paragraph No. 13 in D.25-01-036 authorizes GSWC to file a Tier 1 advice letter to implement a surcharge to true-up the revenue difference between the interim rates and the final rates. Specifically, Ordering Paragraph No. 13 states,

The surcharge to true-up the interim rates must comply with Standard Practice U-27-W. Golden State Water Company shall file its tariff implementing the surcharge to true-up its interim rates by Tier 1 advice letter after GSW calculates the revenue difference between the interim rates and the authorized rates, but within 90 days after 2025 rates have been implemented. The surcharge shall include differences between interim rates and adopted rates through the implementation date of the 2025 rates.

In compliance with the above Ordering Paragraph No. 13, GSWC has recorded the difference between the interim rates and final rates for the period of January 1, 2025 through January 31, 2025. This amount totals \$4,416,032.

As shown in the supporting workpapers for each CSA, the total revenue shortfall, the amortization period and the respective temporary surcharges are as follows:

Please note: GSWC's Companywide Schedule No, AA-4, Private Protection Service, experienced a revenue shortfall of \$45,521 during the interim rate period and customers served under this schedule will receive a surcharge of \$0.125, per month, per meter for each inch of diameter of service connection.

If there are residual balances at the end of the 12-month amortization period, GSWC will roll those balances over to the General Ratemaking Area Balancing Account (GRABA), for that specific ratemaking area.

GSWC will provided the Water Division and the Public Advocates Office with supporting workpapers.

Effective Date

GSWC is requesting that this advice letter become effective on May 1, 2025.

Customer Notice

GSWC will include a bill message on the customer's first bill after the increase goes into effect to inform customers of this compliance rate surcharge increase.

Response or Protest

Anyone may submit a response or protest for this Advice Letter (AL). When submitting a response or protest, **please include the utility name and advice letter number in the subject line.**

A **response** supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the AL. A **protest** objects to the AL in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

- 1. The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the AL;
- 2. The relief requested in the AL would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- 3. The analysis, calculations, or data in the AL contain material error or omissions;
- 4. The relief requested in the AL is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
- 5. The relief requested in the AL requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the AL process; or
- 6. The relief requested in the AL is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory, provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require re-litigating a prior order of the Commission.

A protest may not rely on policy objections to an AL where the relief requested in the AL follows rules or directions established by statute or Commission order applicable to the utility. A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest.

WD must receive a response or protest via email (<u>or</u> postal mail) within 20 days of the date the AL is filed. When submitting a response or protest, **please include the utility name and advice letter number in the subject line.** The addresses for submitting a response or protest is:

Cities and counties that need Board of Supervisors or Board of Commissioners approval to protest should inform DWA, within the 20 day protest period, so that a late filed protest can be entertained. The informing document should include an estimate of the date the proposed protest might be voted on.

Replies

The utility shall reply to each protest and may reply to any response. Any reply must be received by WD within five business days after the end of the protest period, and shall be served on the same day on each person who filed the protest or response to the AL. The actions requested in this advice letter are not now the subject of any formal filings with the California Public Utilities Commission, including a formal complaint, nor action in any court of law.

No individuals or utilities have requested notification of filing of tariffs. Distribution of this advice letter is being made to the attached service list in accordance with General Order No. 96-B.

- Subject to the approval of the utility, any change in the location or construction of the private fire (T) service facilities as may be requested by public authority or the customer will be made by the utility following payment to the utility of the entire cost of such change.
- The customer's installation must be such as to separate effectively the private fire service (T) facilities from that of the customer's regular domestic water service. Any unauthorized use of water from the private fire service facilities will be charged for at the applicable tariff rates and may be grounds for the utility's discontinuing private fire service without liability to the utility.
- There shall be no cross connection between the systems supplied by water through the utility's private fire service facilities and any other source of supply without the specific approval of the utility. The specific approval, if given, will at least require at the customer's expense, a special double check valve installation or other backflow prevention device acceptable to the utility. Any unauthorized cross connection may be grounds for immediately discontinuing private fire service without liability to the utility.

The customer shall indemnify the utility and save it harmless against any and all claims arising out of service under this schedule and shall further agree to make no claims against the utility for any loss or damage resulting from service under this schedule. Section 774 of the Public Utilities Code limits the liability of the utility resulting from a claim regarding adequacy of pressure of supply for fire protection service.
- 14. The customer shall be responsible for the periodic testing of any black flow prevention devices (T) as required by public authority or the utility. Any repair or replacement of such devices or of any other facilities installed to provide private fire service shall be done at the customer's expense. Any refusal to comply with the above requirements may be grounds for the utility's discontinuing private fire service without liability to the utility.
