### **PURPOSE**

This advice letter submittal seeks to implement Escalation Year 2026 water rates, as authorized by the California Public Utilities Commission ("Commission"), for the Simi Valley CSA. GSWC's request is pursuant to Decision No. ("D.") 25-01-036, dated January 30, 2025 for General Rate Case Application No. 23-08-010.

Specifically, Ordering Paragraph No. 12 of the Decision states,

12. For escalation year 2026 and 2027, Golden State Water Company shall file Tier 1 advice letters, in conformance with General Order 96-B and the Revised Water Rate Case Plan (Decision 07-05-062), proposing new revenue requirements and corresponding revised tariff schedules in each rate Simi Valley and rate area in this proceeding, and in conformance with the Settlement Agreement and adopted estimated rates for each rate area as illustrated in the attached Appendices. This filing shall be subject to approval by the Commission's Water Division.

## **RATE OF RETURN**

The following summary lists the Recorded, Authorized, Adjusted Authorized, and Proforma rates of return in GSWC's Simi Valley CSA for twelve months ending September 2025. The pro forma rate of return is calculated in accordance with guidelines provided by the Water Division.

Recorded	6.92%
Authorized	7.93%
Adjusted Authorized	9.21%
Pro forma	6.53%

As shown above, the Pro-forma return is less than the Authorized rate of return. As such, no earnings adjustment is required for the proposed 2026 water rate increase.

Detailed workpapers supporting the proposed rate increase and rate calculations are being supplied to the Commission Staff.

### ADVICE LETTER PROJECTS

The Parties to the Settlement Agreement adopted in D.25-01-036 agreed to 75 capital projects that GSWC may treat as Advice Letter Projects totaling \$75,887,649 for costs incurred after December 31, 2022.¹ The 2023 GRC Capital Memorandum Account tracks accrued interest during the construction period for each Advice Letter Project at GSWC's adopted cost of debt until the assets are in service, and the full rate of return and applicable components of revenue requirement, such as depreciation and property taxes, for each project from the period the assets are in service to the date GSWC files its attrition year filings for 2026 and 2027. As authorized, when GSWC files its 2026 and 2027 attrition filings, the completed assets and the associated amounts recorded in the 2023 GRC Capital Memorandum Account shall be added to the adopted rate base, subject to Commission confirmation that the amounts were appropriately recorded in the 2023 GRC Capital Memorandum Account.

The Preliminary Statement for the 2023 GRC Capital Memorandum Account was approved in GSWC's Advice Letter No. 1957-W, pursuant to D. 25-01-036.

For the Simi Valley CSA, GSWC is adding \$732,891 to rate base for the cost of the completed Advice Letter Project and \$200,421 for the associated balance in the 2023 GRC Capital Memorandum Account, which results in an addition to rate base of \$890,366 after adjustments for accumulated depreciation.

#### **COMPLIANCE**

GSWC is filing this Tier 1 advice letter to implement rates for Escalation Year 2026. GSWC is authorized to increase rates in its Simi Valley CSA by \$937,798 or 5.0%.

GSWC has computed the 2026 Escalation Year using the escalation methodology set forth in the Revised Rate Case Plan, the escalation factors as of October 2025, as published by the Public Advocates Office Water Branch, and the September 2025 CPI-U plus the addition of the advice letter projects authorized in D.25-01-036, as described above.

## **EFFECTIVE DATE**

As directed, the effective date of these revised tariffs shall be January 1, 2026.

#### **NOTICE**

Customer Notice: This is a Tier 1 advice letter that does not require customer notification, as provided in Water Industry Rule 7.3.1 of General Order 96-B. GSWC will include a bill message on each customer's first bill after the increase goes into effect to inform its Simi Valley CSA customers of this rate increase.

# **RESPONSE OR PROTEST**

Anyone may submit a response or protest for this Advice Letter (AL). When submitting a response or protest, please include the utility name and advice letter number in the subject line.

A **response** supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter. A **protest** objects to the AL in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

- 1. The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the AL;
- 2. The relief requested in the AL would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- 3. The analysis, calculations, or data in the AL contain material error or omissions;
- 4. The relief requested in the AL is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or

- 5. The relief requested in the AL requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the AL process; or
- 6. The relief requested in the AL is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory, provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require re-litigating a prior order of the Commission.

A protest may not rely on policy objections to an AL where the relief requested in the AL follows rules or directions established by statute or Commission order applicable to the utility. A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest.

The informing document should include an estimate of the date the proposed protest might be voted on.

# **REPLIES**

The utility shall reply to each protest and may reply to any response. Any reply must be received by the Water Division within five business days after the end of the protest period, and shall be served on the same day on each person who filed the protest or response to the AL.

The actions requested in this advice letter are not now the subject of any formal filings with the California Public Utilities Commission, including a formal complaint, nor action in any court of law.
