Golden State Water Company (GSWC) hereby transmits the attached tariff sheets applicable to its ratemaking service areas.

These tariffs are submitted pursuant to General Order No. 96-B. Pursuant to General Order No. 96-B Water Industry Rule 7.3.2.(4), this advice letter is designated as a Tier 1 Advice Letter.

Purpose

This advice letter is submitted pursuant to Preliminary Statement I for the Monterey-Water Revenue Adjustment Mechanism Balancing Account (M-WRAM) and Preliminary Statements J, K & L for the "Incremental Cost Balancing Accounts (ICBAs) for purchased water, pump tax and purchased power, respectively, authorized by Decision (D.) 25-01-036 for GSWC's 2023 General Rate Case (GRC).

Discussion

On January 30, 2025, the Commission resolved GSWC's GRC, in D.25-01-036 for Application (A.) 23-08-010. The Commission adopted the following Ordering Paragraph 4, which states:

- 4. Golden State Water Company shall transition to the Monterey Water Revenue Adjustment Mechanism, establish an Incremental Cost Balancing Account, and discontinue its use of the full Water Revenue Adjustment Mechanism and Modified Cost Balancing Account.*

M-WRAM tracks the difference between quantity revenues collected under each residential rate tier and the quantity revenues that would have been collected under a single quantity rate at the equivalent level of sales.

The ICBAs tracks the incremental difference between actual cost for water production (purchased water, purchased power, and pump taxes) and adopted costs reflected in rates. The ICBAs have an effective date of January 1, 2025, the first day of the first test year in GRC A.23-08-010.

Accordingly, GSWC requests to amortize the net amount of the combined balances recorded in the M-WRAM and the ICBA's for calendar year 2025, consistent with the Disposition provisions of Preliminary Statement I, J, K & L of these accounts in each of the following areas: Northern Consolidated Ratemaking Area (Arden Cordova and Clearlake), Bay Point, , Los Osos, Santa Maria, Simi Valley, Region 2 and Region 3. GSWC is authorized to amortized the balances in these accounts by a Tier 1 advice letter annually.

GSWC requests to implement a surcharge¹ to recover the under collection in its Bay Point, Los Osos, Santa Maria, and Region 3 Customer Service Areas. Additionally, GSWC is requesting to refund the over collection in its Northern Consolidated, Simi Valley and Region 2 Customer Service Areas through a one-time credit. See table below for a summary of the amortization details:

A **response** supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the AL. A **protest** objects to the AL in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

1. The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the AL;
2. The relief requested in the AL would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
3. The analysis, calculations, or data in the AL contain material error or omissions;
4. The relief requested in the AL is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
5. The relief requested in the AL requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the AL process; or
6. The relief requested in the AL is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory, provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require re-litigating a prior order of the Commission.

A protest may not rely on policy objections to an AL where the relief requested in the AL follows rules or directions established by statute or Commission order applicable to the utility. A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest.

Cities and counties that need Board of Supervisors or Board of Commissioners approval to protest should inform DWA, within the 20 day protest period, so that a late filed protest can be entertained. The informing document should include an estimate of the date the proposed protest might be voted on.

Replies

The utility shall reply to each protest and may reply to any response. Any reply must be received by WD within five business days after the end of the protest period, and shall be served on the same day on each person who filed the protest or response to the AL.

The actions requested in this advice letter are not now the subject of any formal filings with the California Public Utilities Commission, including a formal complaint, nor action in any court of law.

No individuals or utilities have requested notification of filing of tariffs. Distribution of this advice letter is being made to the attached service list in accordance with General Order No. 96-B.
