These tariffs are submitted pursuant to General Order No. 96-B. Pursuant to General Order No. 96-B Water Industry Rule 7.3.2.(4), this advice letter is designated as a Tier 1 Advice Letter.

Supplement

This supplemental filing is being made as a result of Water Division's staff review recommendations and revised rate from the Randall-Bold Treatment Plant. This filing will replace Advice Letter 1998-W in its entirety.

Purpose

GSWC is seeking authorization from the California Public Utilities Commission (Commission) to adjust the water rates in its Bay Point CSA by -\$171,315 or -1.93% to offset purveyor rate changes for purchased water costs.

Background

GSWC purchases water from the Contra Costa Water District (CCWD). On November 20, 2025, GSWC filed AL 1985-W to implement a supply offset and increase rates, effective January 1, 2026. Recently, CCWD has updated their water rates resulting in an adjustment in purchase water supply expenses of -\$167,891.

Revenues to cover the supply expense rate changes would also adjust the uncollectible and franchise fees expenses by -\$1,467 and -\$1,957, respectively, from the amounts currently reflected in GSWC's rates.

Copies of detailed workpapers supporting the proposed rate adjustment and rate calculations have been provided to the Commission staff in accordance with Standard Practice U-27-W.

Effective Date

GSWC is requesting this filing become effective July 1, 2026.

Notice

No individuals or utilities have requested notification of filing of tariffs. Distribution of this advice letter is being made to the attached service list in accordance with Section 4.3 of General Order No. 96-B.

GSWC will notify its customers of this rate adjustment by placing a message on the customer's water bills that are generated after the rates go into effect.

Response or Protest

Anyone may submit a response or protest for this Advice Letter (AL). When submitting a response or protest, **please include the utility name and advice letter number in the subject line.**

A **response** supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the AL. A **protest** objects to the AL in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

1. The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the AL;
2. The relief requested in the AL would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
3. The analysis, calculations, or data in the AL contain material error or omissions;
4. The relief requested in the AL is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
5. The relief requested in the AL requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the AL process; or
6. The relief requested in the AL is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory, provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require re-litigating a prior order of the Commission.

A protest may not rely on policy objections to an AL where the relief requested in the AL follows rules or directions established by statute or Commission order applicable to the utility. A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest.

WD must receive a response or protest via email (**or** postal mail) within 20 days of the date the AL is filed. When submitting a response or protest, **please include the utility name and advice letter number in the subject line.** The addresses for submitting a response or protest is:

Cities and counties that need Board of Supervisors or Board of Commissioners approval to protest should inform WD, within the 20 day protest period, so that a late filed protest can be entertained. The informing document should include an estimate of the date the proposed protest might be voted on.

Replies

The utility shall reply to each protest and may reply to any response. Any reply must be received by WD within five business days after the end of the protest period, and shall be served on the same day on each person who filed the protest or response to the AL.

The actions requested in this advice letter are not now the subject of any formal filings with the California Public Utilities Commission, including a formal complaint, nor action in any court of law.
