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**SPECIAL CONDITION**

1. All bills are subject to the reimbursement fee set forth on Schedule No. UF.
2. Pursuant to Decision No. 23-06-024 a surcharge of \$0.202 per Ccf will be applied to all metered customer's bills excluding customers that are receiving the CAP credit. This surcharge will offset the CAP credits and CAP administrative program costs recorded in the CAP Balancing Account.
3. As authorized by Rule 9.1.e. for customers with more than one meter on a single service line, the customer's service charge rate is based on a factor multiplied by the service charge applicable to the nearest standard meter size of the combined meters as determined by the equivalent diameter methodology.
4. Non-residential Sprinkler rates can be added as needed utilizing the multiplication factors identified in Appendix F of D. 17-03-001, applied to the 5/8" meter charge.
5. As authorized by the California Public Utilities Commission, an amount of \$0.402 per Ccf based on an 18-month amortization period, is to be added to the Quantity Rate, beginning on July 31, 2023 as indicated in Advice Letter 1898-W. The surcharge may be recalibrated annually, if necessary. This surcharge will recover the under-collection in the WRAM&MCBA Balancing Account.
6. As authorized by the California Public Utilities Commission in D.23-06-024, an amount of \$0.015 per Ccf is to be added to the quantity rate for a period of 12-months, beginning on the effective date of Advice Letter No. 1901-W. The surcharge will amortize the cumulative balance recorded in the Tangible Property Regulation Collateral Consequences Memorandum Account as of September 30, 2020.
7. As authorized by the California Public Utilities Commission in D.23-06-024, an amount of \$0.0007 per Ccf is to be added to the quantity rate for a period of six months, beginning on the effective date of Advice Letter No. 1901-W. The surcharge will amortize the cumulative balance recorded in the School Lead Testing Memorandum Account as of September 30, 2020.
8. As authorized by the California Public Utilities Commission in D.23-06-024, an amount of \$0.00145 per Ccf is to be added to the quantity rate for a period of six months, beginning on the effective date of Advice Letter No. 1901-W. The surcharge will amortize the cumulative balance recorded in the Emergency Consumer Protection Memorandum Account as of September 30, 2020.
9. As authorized by the California Public Utilities Commission in D.23-06-024, an amount of \$0.473 per Ccf is to be added to the quantity rate for a period of 36-months, beginning on the effective date of Advice Letter No. 1908-W. The surcharge recovers the difference between the interim rates and the final rates for the period of January 1, 2022 through July 30, 2023. (L)

Beginning January 1, 2024, as required by Section 792.5 of the Public Utilities Code, an increase in Purchased Water of \$0.39039/Ccf and an increase in Pump Tax of \$0.06590/Ccf, relative to the Purchased Water cost and Pump Tax cost adopted by Decision No. 23-06-024, and an associated revenue increase of 2.52%, are being tracked in a reserve account.
