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**SPECIAL CONDITION**

1. All bills are subject to the reimbursement fee set forth on Schedule No. UF.
2. As authorized by the California Public Utilities Commission, a surcharge of \$0.242 per Ccf will be applied to all metered customer's bills excluding customers that are receiving the CAP credit. This surcharge will offset the CAP credits and CAP administrative program costs recorded in the CAP Balancing Account.
3. As authorized by Rule 9.1.e. for customers with more than one meter on a single service line, the customer's service charge rate is based on a factor multiplied by the service charge applicable to the nearest standard meter size of the combined meters as determined by the equivalent diameter methodology.
4. Non-residential Sprinkler rates can be added as needed utilizing the multiplication factors identified in Appendix F of D. 17-03-001, applied to the 5/8" meter charge.
5. As authorized by the California Public Utilities Commission, an amount of \$0.367 per Ccf based on an 12-month amortization period, is to be added to the Quantity Rate, beginning on May 1, 2025 as indicated in Advice Letter 1958-W. The surcharge may be recalibrated annually, if necessary. This surcharge will recover the under-collection in the WRAM&MCBA Balancing Account. (R)
6. As authorized by the California Public Utilities Commission in D.23-06-024, an amount of \$0.473 per Ccf is to be added to the quantity rate for a period of 36-months, beginning on October 10, 2023. The surcharge recovers the difference between the interim rates and the final rates for the period of January 1, 2022 through July 30, 2023.
7. As authorized by the California Public Utilities Commission, an amount of \$0.001 per Ccf is to be added to the quantity rate for a period of 12-months, beginning on February 1, 2025. The surcharge recovers the balance in the CEMA-Emergency Disaster Relief Customer Outreach.
8. As authorized by the California Public Utilities Commission, an amount of \$0.023 per Ccf is to be added to the quantity rate for a period of 12-months, beginning on February 1, 2025. The surcharge recovers the balance in the CEMA-COVID 19.
9. As authorized by the California Public Utilities Commission in, an amount of \$0.018 per Ccf is to be added to the quantity rate for a period of 12-months, beginning on February 1, 2025. The surcharge recovers the balance in the Public Safety Power Shut-Off Memorandum Account.
10. As authorized by the California Public Utilities Commission, an amount of \$0.003 per Ccf is to be added to the quantity rate for a period of 12-months, beginning on February 1, 2025. The surcharge recovers the balance in the Polyfluoroalkyl Substances Memorandum Account.

11. As authorized by the California Public Utilities Commission, an amount of \$0.016 per Ccf is to be added to the quantity rate for a period of 12-months, beginning on February 1, 2025. The surcharge recovers the balance in the 2021 Water Conservation Memorandum Account.
12. As authorized by the California Public Utilities Commission, an amount of \$0.014 per Ccf is to be added to the quantity rate for a period of 12-months, beginning on February 1, 2025. The surcharge recovers the balance in the Drinking Water Fees Balancing Account.
13. As authorized by the California Public Utilities Commission, an amount of \$0.001 per Ccf is to be added to the quantity rate for a period of 12-months, beginning on February 1, 2025. The surcharge recovers the balance in the CEMA - Extreme Heat Event.
14. As authorized by the California Public Utilities Commission in an amount of \$0.079 per Ccf is to be added to the quantity rate for a period of 12-months, beginning on May 1, 2025. The surcharge recovers the difference between the interim rates and the final rates for the period of January 1, 2025 through January 31, 2025.
