APPLICABILITY This Schedule applies to all Golden State Water Company (GSWC) water customers in all Customer Service Areas. This Schedule is effective in times of voluntary conservation or mandatory rationing, as required by Rule No. 14.1. To the extent any provision in this Schedule is inconsistent with Rule No. 14.1, the provisions of this Schedule apply. The drought emergency surcharges listed in this Schedule are in addition to the regular water-use charges under the applicable Schedules as authorized by the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) for the respective ratemaking area. **B. TERRITORY** This Schedule is applicable to all GSWC water customers in California. (T) C. MANDATORY RESTRICTIONS (L) (L) (N) The State Water Resources Control Board has established the following mandatory restrictions for all (N) water users. (L) No Customer shall use utility-supplied water for non-essential or unauthorized uses as defined below; customers shall take actions to reduce non-essential and unauthorized water use accordingly as identified below: a. The application of potable water to outdoor landscapes in a manner that causes runoff onto adjacent property, non-irrigated areas, private and public walkways, roadways, parking lots, or structures. b. The use of a hose that dispenses potable water to wash a motor vehicle, except where the hose is fitted with a shut-off nozzle or device attached to it that causes it to cease dispensing water immediately when not in use. c. The use of potable water for washing buildings, structures, sidewalks, walkways, patios, tennis courts, or other hard-surfaced, non-porous areas. d. The use of potable water in a fountain or other decorative water feature, except where the water is part of a recirculating system. e. The use of potable water for watering outside plants, lawn, landscape, and turf area during certain hours prohibited by applicable laws or rules, during and up to 48 hours after measurable rainfall (0.1" or more). f. GSWC will promptly notify customers when aware of leaks within the customer's control; the failure to repair any leaks, breaks, or other malfunction resulting in water waste in a customer's domestic or outdoor water system within forty-eight (48) hours of notification by the utility, unless other, specific arrangements are made with and agreed to by the utility. g. The serving of water, other than upon request, in eating and drinking establishments, including but not limited to restaurants, hotels, cafes, bars, or other public places where food or drink are served and/or purchased.
